

## Some notes for competitors concerning 12 car rallies

These are evening navigation rallies of approximately 60 miles length.

### Dates

They start at a range of different locations but all within a reasonable distance from Loughborough.

### Timetable.

Signing on 18.45

Beginners packs available from 19.20

First car start 20.01

Finish between 22.00 and 23.00

### Classes

There are three classes, which class a crew enters depends upon the Navigator's experience only.

**BEGINNER:** The navigator has done no more than three 12 cars. They get beginners pack 40 minutes before their start time. The beginners pack contains all the hand outs, the time card & the novice help sheet. They are allowed to receive external help at any time.

**NOVICE:** The navigator has not finished third or higher on 3 twelve cars. They get the Novice Help Sheet on the start line when they get their first handout. The rest of the handouts are issued at the appropriate control. Note a crew can elect to retain their Novice status subject to the committee's endorsement.

**EXPERT:** After qualifying as an expert a crew may elect to remain as Novices or move to Expert status. Experts get the time card and first handout at the first control. All other handouts are issued at the appropriate control

### Give way junctions

Competitors are required to come to a complete halt at all junctions marked on the road (or roadside) as a Give Way junction. This is not optional. A complete halt means ceasing forward motion; with the wheels stationary for long enough that an observer can clearly see the car has stopped. The Competition Secretary will appoint a club Judge of Fact to observe this.

**Regularity**

To avoid head scratching navigational puzzles (and in order to get a result in the case of a tie) organizers may consider including a regularity section within the event to function as a tie break.

**Timing**

The event will be timed at an average of 28mph.

**Code boards**

Boards marked with combinations of letters and numbers will be used to establish that competitors have followed the correct route. Competitors must record these when they see them.

**Entry Fee**

£15.00 per car booked in advance BUT £20 for those who turn up without pre booking.

**Insurance**

Each competing car should have adequate insurance, either their own or using the Club scheme.
